





AWARD SCHEME



The aim of this award is to encourage the Juniors to live their everyday Christian life serving Christ and the Church



In CE, children and young people are trained to serve Christ through taking part in a regular church based meeting and many of the sections can be completed as part of this.





Irish CE Award Scheme

Role of the Leader

Many of these Awards can be obtained by the Juniors participating in the weekly meeting. The Awards can be part of the meeting every week, or as a project on a theme for a short spell. Appendix 1 will help you as a leader to keep track of the childrens progress.

Appendix 2 is a mini certificate you may wish to give out to the children as they complete each section.

Age Limit

Leaders should guide their Juniors to the subjects most suitable for them. Some subjects are best tackled by the more mature child, others lend themselves to all age groups. Juniors who transfer to a Young Peoples society may continue the Scheme in YPCE.

The Examiners

The examiners are as indicated for each Award . mostly the Society Leader.

The Awards

The Leader must complete a form (appendix 3a, 3b or 3c) for each Junior when they are eligible for an award. This form should be sent to the Irish Junior Convenor at least three weeks before the Irish CE Convention as the awards are presented there. Bronze award is a certificate, silver is a certificate and gift, Gold award receives a certificate, gift and badge. There is no charge for these awards for Groups who have paid their Annual Subscription to Christian Endeavour.

Literacy Problems

Juniors/YPs with literacy problems should be encouraged to take part in the Scheme. In written tests, it is permissible for the leader (or someone appointed by them) to read the questions and write down the answers given by the Junior/YP.

Requirements

Bronze

6 sections must be completed. The following 3 sections must be completed:

- 1 Bible Knowledge, part 1
- 2 Healthy Living, part 1
- 3 Junior Guide to CE, Promises

Plus 3 from the optional list

Silver

12 sections must be completed, the 6 required for the bronze award, along with the following:

- Bible knowledge, part 2
- 2 Healthy Living, part 2
- 3 Junior Guide to CE, %How CE Started+

Plus a further 3 from the optional list

Gold

20 sections must be completed for this award. The 12 required for silver along with the following:

- 1 Bible knowledge, part 3
- 2 Healthy living, part 3
- 3 Junior Guide to CE, Whole Booklet

Plus a further 5 from the optional list

The question papers for the Bible Knowledge and for part 2 and 3 of the Junior Guide to CE, will consist of questions requiring one or two word answers.





OPTIONAL

Bible Books

Recite the names of all the books of the Bible in correct order.

Examiner . Society leader



Memory Verses & Witness

Memorise the following 4 Bible verses and be able to explain the points they make. An example of this is on appendix 4 or you may write your own.

- 1 Psalm 100 v 5
- 2 Romans 6 v 23
- 3 Romans 5 v 8
- 4 1 John 1 v 9

All four verses including their meaning to be said in front of an examiner, to a good standard, who will confirm if passed.

Examiner . Minister, Church Elder or School Teacher

Public Bible Reading

This award will be gained by a good standard of reading with understanding of a Bible passage at a church service or CE Parents night etc.

Examiner . Society Leader or Minister

Daily Bible Reading

Do a daily Bible Reading and for 3 months keep a note of;

- 1 Date
- 2 Bible verses (e.g. John 14: 1-14)
- 3 1 or 2 sentence summary.

Examiner - Notes to be given to the Society Leader to mark and confirm completed

Bible Poster

Design a poster clearly showing some aspect of a Bible passage. E.g. The armour of God, Daniel in the Lions Den.

Examiner . Society Leader or other suitable adult. Alternatively, send it as an entry for the CE Convention Competitions, see your Junior Pack

The 10 Commandments

Learn by heart the 10 commandments, a simplified version is acceptable - see appendix 5

Examiner - Society Leader

Crafts

Enter the craft section of the CE convention competition . see Junior Pack.

Examiner . send entries to Irish CE Headquarters or the Assistant Irish Junior Convenor

Missionary

Write a summary of the current CE Missionary Project or another project your CE are supporting. It should cover the following headings:

- 1 Name of Project
- What do they do and where
- 3 What are their prayer needs
- What are you/your society doing to support them.

Examiner . Your local church missionary representative

Instrumentalist/Pianist

Playing any musical instrument, lead four different Christian songs/choruses at the weekly society meeting. N.B This can be done on one night or over a six month period.

Examiner . Society Leader

Singer

- 1 Sing a Christian song as a solo or duet at your Society meeting.
- 2 Sing a Christian song as a solo or duet at your local Church, or teach your Society a new Christian song.

Examiner . Society Leader

Drama

Take a speaking part in a drama production for your CE or Church/Sunday School.

Examiner . Society Leader, Minister or Sunday School Leader

Participation

Take part in one of the following 3 activities:

- 1 Irish Junior CE Table Quiz
- 2 Talent Contest/CEcs Got Talent
- 3 Submit an entry to the Convention Competitions and attend the Junior Rally at the convention

Examiner. Irish Junior Convenor /Local Convenor (speak to them at the event)





Chairperson

- 1 Chair one of the weekly meetings
- 2 Draw up a programme for this meeting without adult help.
- 3 Be able to give a good welcome and word of thanks afterwards indicating that you have understood the message.

Examiner - Society leader

Speaker

- 1 Speak on a Bible story at the Society meeting (3-5mins)
- Write a short quiz on the above Bible story.


or

- 1 Give a talk based on one of the lessons in the programme book your society uses.
- 2 Guide the other society members through the activity sheet.

Examiner . Society leader

Prayer

1 Open or close a society meeting with prayer



3 Understand and explain different types of prayer, e.g. thanksgiving, confession, intercession.

Examiner . Society Leader

Camper

Attend a Christian camp and participate fully in the activities

Examiner . Camp Leader

Faithful Attendant

The Society Leader will keep a register book or individual cards for each junior and record their attendance. Over a complete session (i.e. minimum October to March) only two absences will be permitted (leader may use their discretion if child unable to attend for a genuine reason). A certificate will be awarded to each faithful attendant.

Examiner . Society Leader

Letter Writing

- Write a letter or email to someone inviting them to speak at your meeting. Remember to include the date, time, place and what is expected of the speaker.
- Write or email a note to a friend telling them about CE.

Examiner . Society Leader

Publicity

Make a colourful, eye-catching poster advertising your Junior CE meeting and display it in your Church hall, if possible. Remember to include day, time and where the meeting is held.

Examiner . Society Leader or other suitable adult. Alternatively, send it as an entry for the CE Convention Competitions, see your Junior Pack

Journalist

Write an article for JuniorsqOwn, your own church magazine or local paper telling about a special event at your CE. This can either be written before the event inviting people to attend or after to let people know what happened. N.B It is not essential for the report to be published but remember that the JuniorsqOwn Editor and the Irish Information Officer love to receive letters from Juniors so feel free to forward them on.

Examiner . Society Leader

Practical Responsibility - Home

For 3 months:

- 1 make your bed every day
- 2 help with dishes once a day (wash/dry or put away)
- once a week help around house. E.g. wash car, gardening, vacuuming, and dusting.

Appendix 6 is a sample letter/form to send to parents for them to sign and confirm the child completed the tasks.

Examiner . Parent/Guardian

Practical Responsibility - Church

Over 6 months, perform eight tasks of a practical nature.

The Junior should help regularly in a variety of ways with activities being supervised by an adult who would sign the Juniors record sheet (appendix 7) on completion of the activity. Examples of the kind of work the child can help with are:

- cleaning the Church/halls
- washing or drying dishes up after church activities
- hand out/collect hymnbooks (or sheets)
- leaflet distribution
- picking up litter in Church grounds
- tidying the grounds

These are only examples and may be adjusted according to your church needs.

Memory Verses & Witness

1 God loves me

Psalm 100v5 . God really loves you! There is nothing you can do to make God love you any more or less then He does right now. There is nothing God wants more than to love and be loved by you.

2 I have sinned

Romans 6v23. Sin is doing something God wouldnot want us to do. It can hurt us, our families, our friends and keep us from God.

3 Jesus died for me

Romans 5v8. Weave all done bad things and deserve to be punished. But God loved you so much that he sent Jesus to come and die in your place. Jesus died so that we can have eternal life.

4 I need to decide to live for God

1 John 1v9. God has shown how much he loves you. To have God in your life all you have to do is say lon sorry for the bad things you have done and ask Him into your heart.
