Instructions

All singing classes (1-3 & 14-17), **1** hymn or sacred song, may have piano, guitar or instrumental accompaniment, live or recorded.

All instrument classes (7-13), **1** hymn or sacred song. Please note that if the piece is short, the adjudicator may ask for it to be played twice.

Classes 10-12 may have piano, guitar or instrumental accompaniment, live or recorded.

Class 13 must be accompanied by piano, guitar, instrumental. live or recorded

Classes 4-6, should be read. not learnt by heart.

Class 18, Drama should last no longer than 8 minutes. Use of puppets is permitted. Leaders may not take part.

No child may enter more than 3 classes between numbers 1-13

Ages to be reckoned on 31 December 2018

No prompting is allowed, except by the Adjudicator

Please emphasise to Juniors and Parents that the Talent Contest is for enjoyment and should not be taken too seriously.

Leaders please note that you are responsible for the return of all cups to your Local Convenor by 3 March 2019. Local Convenors are responsible for engraving names on **base** of cups

IRISH CE AWARD SCHEME



Children enjoy getting rewarded for their achievements, and our new Award Scheme means they get rewarded for what they do at Junior Christian Endeavour. In this scheme, the children work towards bronze, silver and gold awards.

The scheme encourages children to use their many talents in service for Christ and the Church, and is simple to operate. Some of the tasks are compulsory and there is a wide range of optional tasks to choose from.

Dong be put off by the term <u>equestion</u> papers The questions are straight forward and require one word or short phrase answers.

Children as young as 5 years can start working towards their bronze certificate, and the scheme has been designed so that it is possible to reach goldqby the time they are leaving Junior CE. Most of the tasks can be written into the normal weekly programme.

Please take time to read over the Award Scheme and encourage your Juniors to participate in it. If you do not have a copy of this please contact CE Headquarters.

We look forward to requests for question papers and news of Juniors having completed enough tasks to be awarded certificates.
